**I've heard that the rabies vaccine is good for three years. If so, why are you recommending that my pet get it every year?** The rabies vaccine we use is licensed for one year only. Such a vaccine may be easier on your pet's system. Rabies is one of the deadliest zoonotic diseases known to man. Annual vaccination will ensure maximum immunity and protection for your pet AND your family against this deadly disease

**Does my pet need his/her other vaccines every year? I don't want to over-vaccinate.** Neither do we. That's why we don't recommend the feline leukemia vaccine for older cats or the leptospirosis vaccine for dogs in low risk environments. In addition, some vaccines in older pets (that have been properly vaccinated when young) can be administered at extended intervals (i.e. every 3 years or so) depending upon vaccine type, exposure risk and immunocompetence of your pet. Feel free to discuss the pros and cons of vaccination schedules with us at any time.

**My dog stays indoors. Why does he/she need to be on heartworm prevention?** Have you ever seen a mosquito in your home? Sure you have. And that means your dog is at risk of exposure to heartworms. Heartworm preventive medication also protects your dog against intestinal roundworms, which can also infect humans (especially children) and cause blindness (*ocular larval migrans*). In other words, heartworm medication not only protects your pet, but protects your family as well.
